## Speech at the ICLEI World Congress Opening Plenary by ICLEI President Ashok Sridharan, Mayor of Bonn

delivered at the ICLEI World Congress, Montréal, Canada, 19 June 2018

Your Excellencies, Ministries of Quebec and Canada, Honorable Mayor Plante, Special Representative to the ICLEI Presidency David Cadman, Secretary General Gino General Van Begin, Honorable members of the ICLEI Council and the Global Executive Committee, honorable ICLEI members, Mayors, Governors, esteemed guests and participants,

During the last two years I have worked closely with Mayor Park as his First Vice President. I am deeply honored to succeed him as ICLEI President. On behalf of the incoming Global Executive Committee, I would like to express our gratitude to Mayor Park for his unique leadership, for his dedication and for the milestones he achieved for our organization during his three years of service, in particular for his indispensable assistance to establish the ICLEI Beijing Office. Let me add that, in my time working with ICLEI, I have benefited greatly not only from the networking, synergies, support and cooperation provided by the network, but from the friendship I have enjoyed with fellow leaders.

As a compass to manage our rapidly changing urban and global environment we – the ICLEI Members - will drive sustainable action through five critical and strategic pathways which are closely interlinked. I would also like to thank my fellow mayors in the regional executive committees for their great leadership without which we could not build such a robust and effective global network!

While working intensively across regions, I will continue my close cooperation with the World Secretariat. ICLEI opened its first climate unit in Bonn in 2009 and the ICLEI World Secretariat moved to the City of Bonn in 2010. Bonn and ICLEI have worked closely together ever since.

Our working relationship with Secretary General Gino Van Begin and his team is well established and based on trust and reliability. I would like to thank Gino and his staff for their tremendous work and the continual support they deliver to us ICLEI Members and in particular to me and the Global Executive Committee!

I have already extended an invitation to the members of our ICLEI governance bodies to join me in Bonn in June 2019 for a high level political exchange with the Parties to the UNFCCC on the CitiesIPCC process, meeting of the ICLEI leadership and the High Level Track of the ICLEI Resilient Cities Congress, which will celebrate its 10 year anniversary.

Today in Montréal we are celebrating another anniversary – our 10th ICLEI World Congress, graciously hosted by the City of Montréal and my dear colleague Valérie Plante. Madam Mayor, many thanks to you, your team and the people of your beautiful city for your hospitality!
